Do I Need a Church?

By now, hopefully you've figured out that becoming a Christian means a lot more than just saying a few words and then going on about your life doing the same things you've always done. God has made us some promises, including eternal life in His presence, but He has some expectations of us as well. In very simple terms, salvation means accepting Jesus as the Lord (Master) of your life. It means you believe He died on the cross to pay for your sins and He rose from death to conquer death and to intercede on your behalf to God the Father.

In short, He died for you and now He expects you to live for Him.
